Dear Senator Casey:

I'm writing you about health care. Like so many other people in my community, I think it very important that we fix our health care system.

But I am concerned that many people don't have access to care until they are very sick, that costs are climbing much faster than our incomes, that our health insurers have not been serving us well, and that many employers are dropping coverage for their employees.
